What is Kingdom Builders?

Kingdom Builders is our pathway for *creating fully devoted followers of Jesus* by taking the Good News to all nations through a community committed to generously giving their time, talent, and treasure. From kids to adults, anyone can be a Kingdom Builder. This pathway, open to all, is made up of individuals and families that prayerfully commit to *giving above and beyond their tithe to local impact, glocal missions, and future leaders.*



What does it mean to be a Kingdom Builder?

A Kingdom Builder is someone driven by extravagant, sacrificial generosity—giving above and beyond the tithe—to see the vision of God extended to the ends of the earth. Kingdom Builders fuel global missions, expand our local impact, and raise up future leaders for the glory of Jesus Christ.

When you become a Kingdom Builder, you join a movement—an army of passionate believers, determined to bring the hope and love of Jesus into the hardest-to-reach places. Together, we will touch faces unseen, speak names unspoken, and shine light into darkness. Every dollar you give above your tithe—yes, even just one—marks you as a Kingdom Builder. Your tithe (the first 10%) keeps our church strong and healthy, but your Kingdom Builder gift breaks new ground, opening doors for the gospel in places both near and far.

Why should I become a Kingdom Builder?

Because People Matter! People matter to God, and therefore, they matter to us. Our hearts beat for the lost, the hurting, the overlooked. 2026 will be a year when God does exceedingly, abundantly more than we could ever ask, think, or imagine. This is not a new vision—it is the unleashing of the vision God has already entrusted to us. Our mission continues to flourish around the world. In Zimbabwe, Honduras, and India, we will provide widows and orphans a place to call home, put food on their tables through sustainable farms, and ensure clean water flows from wells we have drilled. Children will excel in schools we have built, and all will grow in faith through churches we have planted.

Here in the United States, hope will continue to rise in the Appalachian Mountains for those living in deep poverty. In our own region, our love will be tangible for foster children at Kiana's House, for single mothers receiving their first set of house keys, and for seniors who can move freely in their homes thanks to new handicap ramps and renovated bathrooms. On the campus of APSU, the gospel will spread among students through Chi Alpha (XA), raising up a new generation of bold disciples.



Exceedingly, Abundantly More!

We are excited about future opportunities to pioneer into new places, like, serving on a Native American Indian Reservation in South Dakota, building a Bible college in Tanzania, and sending missionaries to the country of Jordan in partnership with a ministry called Building Bridges.

We will also venture into new territories such as, Tela, Honduras, where we will hold services in local schools, build relationships within the community, supply helpful discipleship tools to leaders, provide biblical education, and minister in the local prison system to bring hope and restoration.

At the same time, we will deepen partnerships with incredible organizations such as Priority One, a church-planting organization that constructs ministry education and training centers throughout India in order to equip and empower local ministers. We will also continue our dedication to partner with Mercy Chefs and Convoy of Hope, who bring practical relief from natural disaster to communities in crisis.

The horizon is wider than ever, and God is calling us to step into it together.

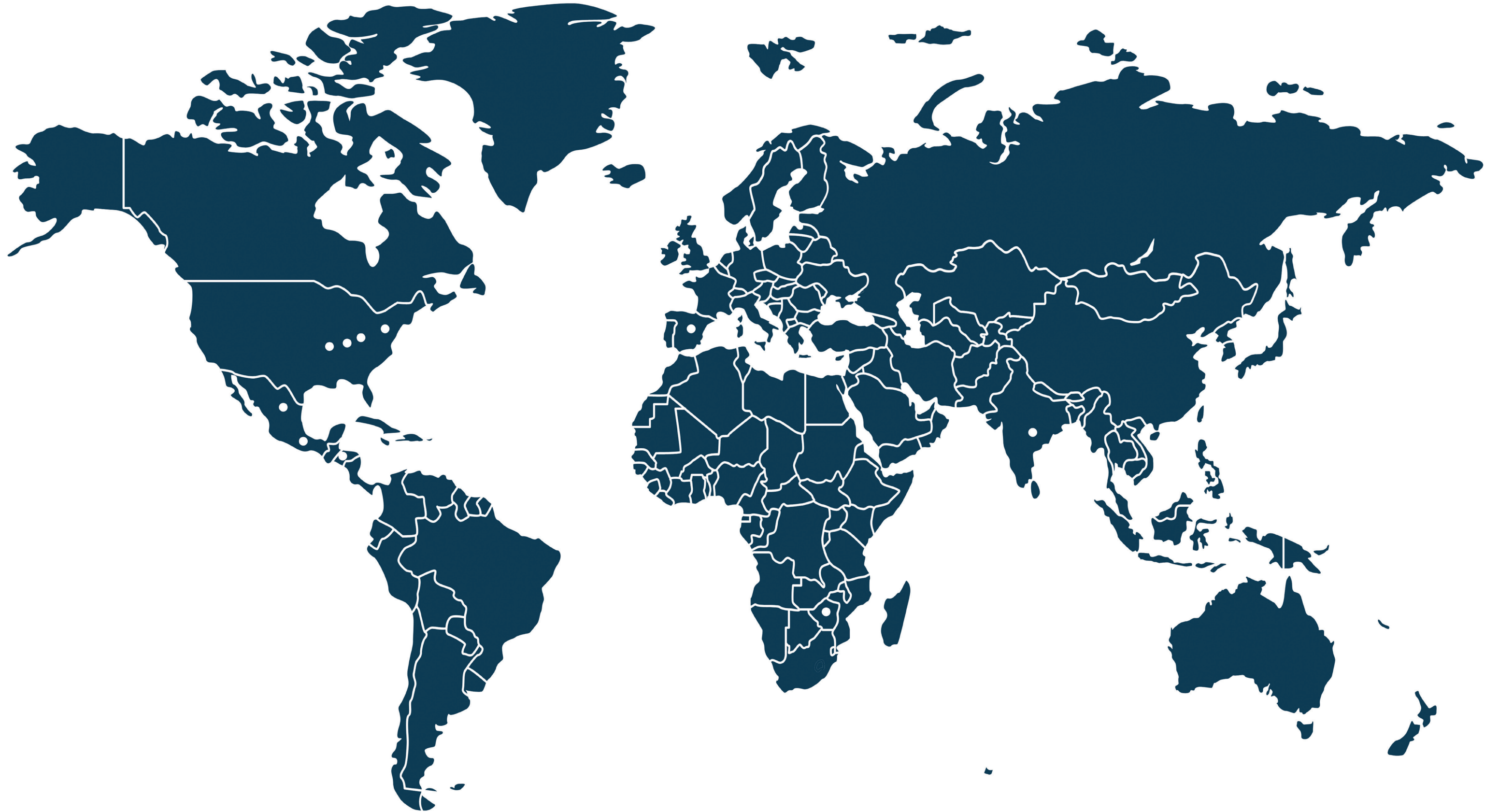

ACROSS THE STREET

We believe that *the light that shines the farthest shines the brightest at home*. Our mission starts in our own community. It is estimated that 160,000 people in our city do not have a church home. Jesus shares the strategy with His disciples in **Acts 1:8 (NLT)** *“you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”*

Jerusalem is our city, Judea is our region, and Samaria is our country. Together with the help of the Holy Spirit, we will go above and beyond in our own community. This is our harvest field for the glory of God.

We reach our city when we create opportunities where people can experience God, build meaningful relationships, and join hands in serving the community. Through our local impact initiatives, we believe we will see new church campuses and worship gatherings spring up in the neighborhoods and regions around us that have yet to experience God through a thriving church community.

When we began reaching across the street in our own city and launched ministry locally seven years ago, this verse was like a compass: **James 1:27 (NLT)** *“pure and genuine religion in the sight of God the Father means caring for orphans and widows in their*

distress and refusing to let the world corrupt you.”

We have been supporting our local foster care families by stepping in with love, practical resources, and spiritual encouragement. By partnering with trusted local agencies and volunteers, we provide safe home environments and a caring community for children and families facing difficult transitions.

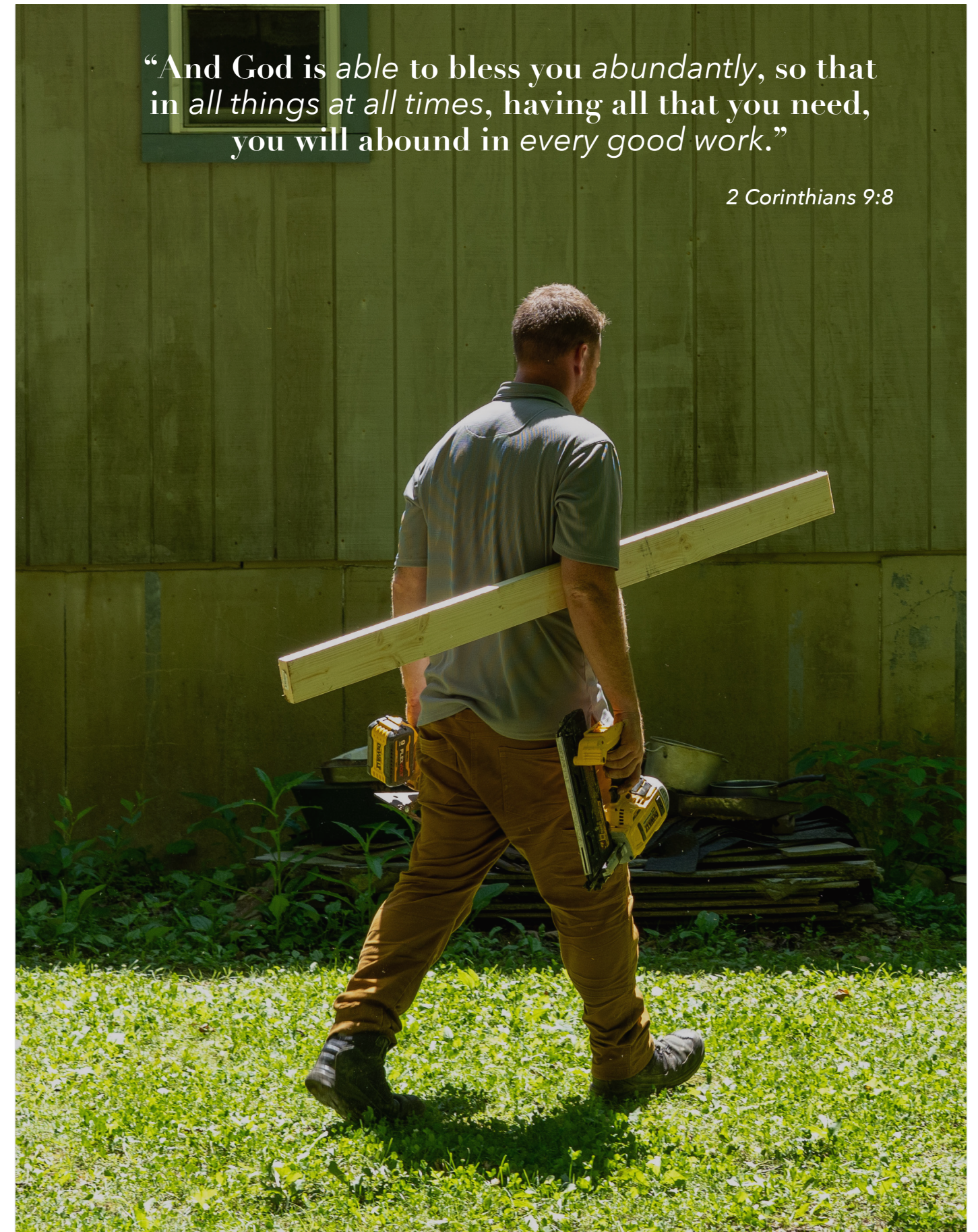

KIANA'S HOUSE: A LEGACY OF LOVE AND RESTORATION

Four years ago, we stood together at a ground-breaking in celebration and hope. We were not simply dedicating land or raising walls, we were honoring a life and a calling.

Kiana's House bears the name of Kiana Long, a young woman whose life was tragically cut short by sickle cell anemia. Though her time on earth was brief, Kiana's life was marked by courage, compassion, and a quiet strength that continues to speak. She knew pain, yet she lived with joy. She knew fragility, yet she gave hope to the children of Mosaic Church every week.

Today, her name stands as a promise that suffering does not get the final word.

Kiana's story calls us to remember that every life matters, no matter how short or challenging the journey. It reminds us that love can outlive loss and that legacy is not measured in years, but in impact. From that sacred remembrance, Kiana's House was born—not as a building alone, but as a refuge filled with purpose.

For children entering foster care, the moment of removal from their family is often filled with fear, confusion, and deep trauma.

Without a place like Kiana's House, many children face what we call the "traumatic cubicle experience" sitting in a Department of Child Services (DCS) office, waiting for hours or days, listening as their story is repeated phone call after phone call, hoping someone will say "yes."

In those moments, dignity can feel lost, and their life is seemingly defined by current circumstances.

Kiana's House interrupts that narrative. Here, children are welcomed into a safe, warm, and stable home during one of the most painful transitions of their lives.

Instead of fluorescent lights and office chairs, they find beds made with care, clothes that fit, nourishing meals, and a loving church family that sees them. They experience what stability looks like, what a home feels like and, for many, what a loving embrace feels like.

The home is thoughtfully equipped with age-appropriate resources that foster dignity and independence allowing children to be children, even in crisis. Every detail speaks "you matter, you are safe, and you are valued."

But Kiana's House is more than a temporary refuge. It is a place of restoration and reconciliation. Families are supported, bridges are rebuilt, and when possible, children are reunited with those they love. Healing happens here, not overnight, but faithfully, with compassion and hope.

What started as an opportunity to honor Kiana's life and share the love she gave our children has become a home that stands as a living testimony that God can transform tragedy into triumph and create beauty from brokenness. Kiana's legacy lives on—in every restored child, every reunited family, and every story rewritten with hope.

Here at Mosaic Church, Matthew 28:19-20 guides our vision and

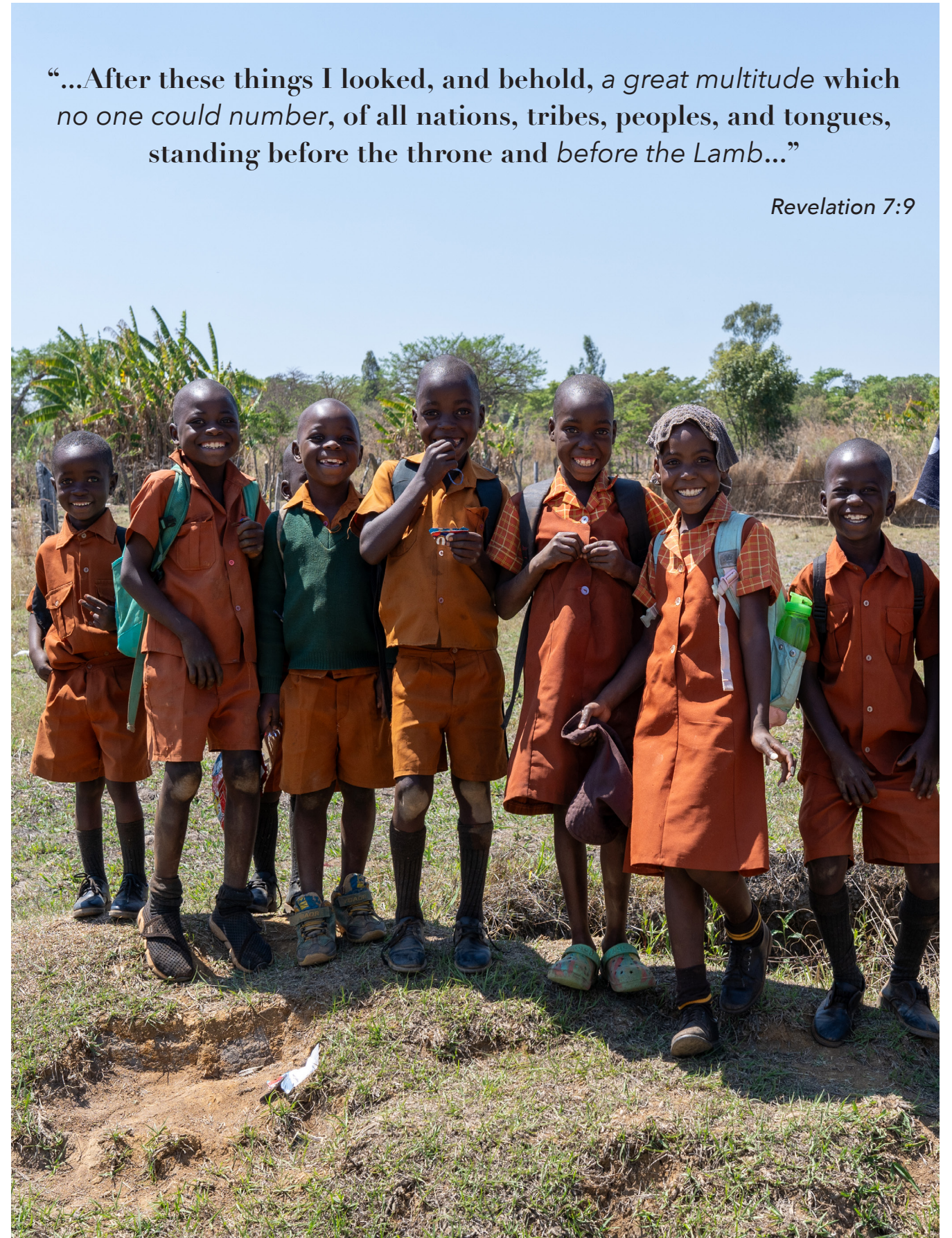

ZIMBABWE CHURCH PLANT

My name is Pastor John Namatira, and my wife, Forsure, and I have the privilege of leading Mosaic Church in Marondera, Zimbabwe. When I reflect on what God has done through this church and through our partnership with Mosaic Church, I am filled with gratitude and awe.

Before Mosaic Church was planted in Marondera, I was living and working in Harare at a lodge. Life during that season was not easy. I faced many challenges, but God had placed a clear vision in my heart: to return to the rural areas and minister to people who had limited access to churches, resources, and hope. Many pastors were not willing to go into these areas, but I felt God calling me there.

In 2011, while working at the lodge, I met Pastor Anthony Daley, Pastor Danny, and the Mosaic Church missions team from America. During our conversations, I shared the vision God had given me to go back to the rural communities and begin ministry there. They listened, prayed with me, and encouraged me.

In 2012, Pastor Daley told me, "I believe this is the right time. You need to follow the vision God has placed in your heart." That confirmation meant everything to me.

In February 2013, we planted Mosaic Church in Marondera. We began meeting at a rural school, but the challenges were many. Sometimes we were not allowed to hold services, especially midweek gatherings or all-night prayers. There were scheduling conflicts with the school, and at times we were asked to cancel or move our services. It was clear we needed a place where we could worship freely.

I shared this need with Pastor Daley, and through Mosaic Church's Going Global initiative, God provided a miracle. Land was purchased, and we began building our own church. Along with the church building, a borehole was drilled to provide clean water to the community. This single act changed lives. People had been walking long distances just to find water, and now they could come to the church and receive what they needed.

The impact of Mosaic Church's support has gone far beyond a building. Spiritually, many people in our rural communities were weary and disconnected from God.

Through the church community, people are encountering Jesus and experiencing new life. Practically, medical and dental outreach programs now serve people within a 40-kilometer radius; many of whom cannot afford hospital care. Through evangelism, we are able to enter villages and share the gospel with people who have never heard the message of Jesus before.

Because of Mosaic Church's partnership, lives are being changed, families are being restored, and hope is growing across our region. I truly believe the future is bright for Marondera and the surrounding communities.

Thank you, Mosaic Church, for believing in the vision, for standing with us, and for helping change so many lives here in Zimbabwe.

Kingdom Builders Partner Story

CHI ALPHA CAMPUS MINISTRIES

Every new semester at Austin Peay State University brings with it thousands of new students with stories yet to be told. They come from the Clarksville community and the farthest reaches of the globe. In Chi Alpha (XA) Campus Ministry, we want to welcome, reach and help reconcile these students to God. But, it may look different than you would think.

Welcoming students around the world starts with a laundry basket. We love to gather some essentials for living that don't fit easily into a single suitcase.

Along with some laundry detergent, washcloths and toiletries we add a handwritten note welcoming them to the campus and if they're looking for one an invitation to the Chi Alpha (XA) family.

“When we align ourselves with the mission of our compassionate and powerful God, there really is no end to the good we can accomplish.”

The note always includes a phone number and an offer for any help they may need. We don't usually hear back, but in 2023 one of those baskets did abundantly more than I could have asked or thought.

My phone rang and Steven from South Africa asked, “Is this the Jonathan that gave me the basket?” I assured him it was me and he proceeded to thank me repeatedly. I extended an invitation to come to our next event, and whether by guilt, obligation or curiosity he showed up.

In Chi Alpha, we don't hide our faith in Jesus, but we also don't hold it as a rite of passage for friendship. We train students to love without any strings attached. So that's what I did with Steven.

By his second visit, my faith seemed to be bumping up against his atheism. He assured me he had no intentions

of looking for a god but agreed to attend my discipleship Core because of friendships he was making.

In addition to sharing life and studying scripture we always take time to lay hands on each other and pray. So, when it was Steven's turn, I was doubly surprised that one: he was willing to receive prayer to a God he didn't believe in and two: he would offer prayer to that same mysterious deity. I told him there was no pressure, but he assured me he had no reservations about asking for blessings and help for these guys that had cared for him so sincerely.

Week after week we shared our lives, studied scripture and prayed for each other. Toward the end of the year, the Lord prompted me to lead our Core in 7 days of fasting and prayer. Again, no obligation to participate, just a simple invitation.

Steven was all in. All in for fasting and praying without trust in God. It's almost like he was borrowing the faith he'd seen demonstrated by his buddies throughout the semester.

To break the fast, we gathered at my place for communion and dinner to follow. After communion Steven pulled me aside with an interesting question. He asked, "I know our official fast is ending but would it be okay if I kept going a little longer?" I was confused as no one wants to fast longer let alone atheists from South Africa. I encouraged him, "totally, but what's up?" He said, "I've been praying like you said every time I felt hungry, and that turned out to be many many times every day."

Steven continued, "By the end of the fast, I realized that for the last twenty-two years I have been trying to satisfy my hunger with many different things like relationships, substances, video games, but none of them really satisfied me. I've finally

discovered its been Jesus I've been hungering for my whole life and if its okay, I'd like to fast just a little bit longer and remind myself to eat in the way that matters most." Holding back tears of gratitude, I assured him to fast as long as he wanted.

That would be a nice end to the story, but the Lord has continued to do exceedingly, abundantly more than I could have ever asked or thought. That was a year ago and since then, Steven has fully committed his life to God, been baptized in water, begun discipling a small group of men, has baptized a couple of them and is now back in South Africa for a month to share the truth he has discovered with his family before returning to APSU to finish his degree. HOW DO I MAKE A COMMITMENT TO BEING A KINGDOM BUILDER?

PRAY

First, *pray to invite God into your journey of generosity.* Prayer is the foundation, allowing you to seek God's guidance and wisdom. Ask Him what a generous life looks like for you and your family. *2 Corinthians 9:7 (NLT) You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully."* In this conversation with God, you will be challenged, but God will meet you in the challenge.

PLAN

Next, *make a plan to give.* Generosity flourishes when it is intentional. What you heard in prayer must write a plan of action. Set a giving goal! *Proverbs 21:5 reminds us, "The plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance."* Take time to develop a plan and bring your family into the experience. Your plan must fit your circumstances, whatever the amount or form of your generosity. Be diligent and obedient to the plan you create.

PARTICIPATE

Finally, *participate in Kingdom Builders.* Put your generosity plan into action! Write down your strategy and commit to it by faith. *Habakkuk 2:2 encourages us to "write the vision clearly, so that anyone may run with it."* Next, deploy your faith and watch as God uses your obedience to bless others and multiply your generosity. The Lord promises to empower Kingdom Builders. *2 Corinthians 9:8 (NLT) And God will generously provide all you need. Then you will always have everything you need and plenty left over to share with others.*
